

We believe no family should have to face this challenge alone.

Through the Healthy Family Connections program, families are connected to additional social supports while increasing their knowledge of age-appropriate expectations for their children. The Strengthening Families group gives parents and children the opportunity to foster healthy attachments while spending quality time together.


