March 21, 2017 **Board Meeting**

Sheryl called the meeting to order at 5:45 p.m.

Minutes of the February 21 meeting were approved. The next meeting is April

Mike presented a bid of \$3,760 for playground dirt and grade work. The board reviewed the bid and voted unanimously to accept it.

Open Session

Three members signed in: Phyllis Cannon, Jessie Phillips and Kathleen Paxton. Sheryl welcomed them and called the session to order at 6 p.m.

Mike gave the maintenance superintendent's report.

Replaced since February 21 were one range, two garbage disposals, one bath faucet, two kitchen floors and one bath floor.

There have been one move-in and one move-out since the last board meeting. Of 105 work orders called in, 92 have been completed.

Alexis presented the office report. Three units are available to accept applications. There have been three intents to vacate, one move-in and two move-ins scheduled. The yard sale is scheduled for May 12 and 13; rain dates are 19 and 20.

Abigail Perez won a \$200 referral bonus.

Carmen presented the managing agent's report. One application has been denied. Linville Management processed \$87,983.23 in accounts payable for the month of February. Financial reports were mailed to the board on

How Payments Are Applied

When you make a payment to Independence Square, the money is applied to your account in this order: attorney fees are paid first, filing fees next, then late charges, work orders and finally, carrying charges.

The money is applied to the work order unless you are on a payment agreement plan.

Doggie waste disposal bags are not toys

Conscientious pet owners who clean up after their pets help keep the grounds neat and clean for everyone to enjoy.

Many pet owners use bags from the disposal stations on the property to remove the pet waste.

Unfortunately, children have been reported to be using the doggie disposal bags as toys.

The bags cost 23 cents a piece. They are provided as a courtesy to all members to help pet owners clean up after their dogs. Pet owners are encouraged to help keep the cooperative's costs down by using plastic shopping bags when they can.

The cooperative is spending more now to refill the disposal stations on our property because children are taking the bags to play with.

When stations are left empty because the bags have been taken as toys, it costs the cooperative in replacement expenses.

Charges apply for bulky trash disposal

The waste disposal company that collects trash from the dumpsters also will haul away large items.

There is a charge, however, for large items the trash collector picks up and hauls away. Costs range from \$3 to \$20 and include chairs, couches, television sets, microwaves, vacuums, tables, dressers, mattresses, bed frames, gas grill and other oversized items.

Barking dogs bother neighbors

Dogs barking continually in backyards can make life miserable for neighbors who must endure the noise.

Dog owners are asked to please be considerate of other members of the cooperative.

Allowing pets to create disturbances is a violation of

Independence Square rules and regulations and places a member in default of the Occupancy Agreement.

Violation of these rules can result in a member's account being sent to the cooperative attorney for Termination of Right to Occupy; in other words, loss of membership.

Independence Square requires that all pets be registered with the office. Pet registration includes a copy of a certificate verifying that vaccinations are current. The certificate also must indicate breed and weight. A photo of your pet must be provided to the office as well.

Grounds Rules Keep Property Looking Good

Independence Square rules and regulations are designed to improve the appearance of the property and the safety and quality of life of all of us who live here.

Please help keep our community clutter-free and attractive. Here are some of the rules members have agreed to follow when they signed their occupancy agreements.

Planting: Planting that could cause structural problems or mowing problems will not be approved.

Vines: Vines will not be allowed on the buildings.

Flower beds: Flower beds in front and back yards shall be planted next to the buildings. They shall not extend beyond the stoop approximately fifty-six inches.

They will be sloped away from the building to allow for drainage. Raised flower beds are not allowed.

Any type of edging used must allow for drainage and may not be taller than six inches.

Yard ornaments: Yard ornaments are to be confined to the flower bed.

Fenced back yards: The member is responsible for fenced back yards. They are to be mowed and kept free of clutter.

Grass should not be more than six inches tall.

If you receive notice from Maintenance to mow your yard, you will have forty-eight hours to do so. If not done in this time period, Maintenance will mow your yard and a fee will be charged.

If a member gets three notices for mowing violations during mowing season, the fence will be removed.

Referral bonus available for members

Members are reminded that a \$200 referral bonus is paid when a member of the cooperative refers a qualifying new member.

Abigail Perez was recognized at the March board meeting for referring a new member to Independence Square Townhouses, Inc.

The referral should be mentioned at the time of application.

The referring member receives \$200 after the applicant moves in.
