BOARD MEETING, June 15, 2010 NEWSLETTER MINUTES

arilyn Porter, president, called the meeting to order at 5:45 p.m. Other board members present were Sheryl Frank, vice president; Ray Gamble, secretary-treasurer; Bill Bailey and Ed Korte. Also attending were Alexis Martin, site manager; Mike Leach, maintenance superintendent; Lisa Gamble, controller for Linville Management Services, Inc.; Dudley Leonard, cooperative attorney; and Billy Still of Still Construction. Minutes of the May 18 board meeting were approved unanimously.

Open Session

One member appeared for the open session. Mike gave the maintenance report. From May 18 through June 15, 89 of 97 work orders were completed. Replaced during this time were two water heaters, one refrigerator, one range, one garbage disposal, one bath faucet and one bath sink. There have been one move-in and one move-out. The renovations are progressing and improvements are under way on building #7.

Alexis gave the office updates. There have been 21 statements of charges due, three attorney referrals, 20 defaults, three vehicle violations and 14 recertification packets mailed. Twenty units are for sale; of these, 14 are vacant. Two move-ins are scheduled for later in the month.


