Marlene Dau New Property Manager for Independence Square

Members had a chance to meet our new property manager during the April open session.

Marlene Dau, president of Tailor Made Property Services, attended the April board meeting. Tailor Made began managing Independence Square in January.

Marlene founded Tailor Made nearly 20 years ago as a full-service property management company offering management, marketing consulting and training services. The name of the company refers to its commitment to tailoring services to meet the specific needs of individual properties.

Based in Chicago, Tailor Made has a satellite office in Kansas City, Mo., and has been managing cooperatives in the area since 2014.

Grounds Rules Keep Property Looking Good

Independence Square rules and regulations are designed to improve the appearance of the property and the safety and quality of life of all of us who live here.

Please help keep our community clutter-free and attractive. Here are some of the rules members have agreed to follow when they signed their Occupancy Agreements.

Members are responsible for maintaining their flower beds and fenced-in backyards.

Planting: Planting that could cause structural problems or mowing problems will not be approved.

Vines: Vines will not be allowed on the buildings.

Flower beds: Flower beds in front and back yards shall be planted next to the buildings. They shall not extend beyond the stoop approximately 56 inches.

They will be sloped away from the building to allow for drainage. Raised flower beds are not allowed.

Any type of edging used must allow for drainage and may not be taller than six inches.

Yard ornaments: Yard ornaments are to be confined to the flower bed.

Fenced back yards: The member is responsible for fenced back yards. They are to be mowed and kept free of clutter.

Grass should not be more than eight inches tall. If you receive notice from Maintenance to mow your yard, you will have 48 hours to do so. If not done in this time period, Maintenance will mow your yard and a charge will be assessed.

If a member gets three notices for mowing violations during mowing season, the fence will be removed.

Members welcome at all open sessions of board meetings

Open sessions of monthly board meetings begin at 6 p.m. on the third Tuesday of the month.

The sessions involve the board of directors, the on-site manager, the maintenance superintendent, property manager, cooperative attorney and other corporation advisers.

The sessions are open to all members of Independence Square.

Minutes of open, closed and executive sessions are a record of what is done or decided during a board meeting. Minutes are not a record of what is said.

If you are interested in hearing the complete discussion of an open session, you are encouraged to attend the session.

Members receive \$200 referral bonuses

Members of Independence Square Townhouses receive \$200 checks as referral bonuses when an applicant they recommend becomes a member.


Karla Garr was recognized for a referral at the April open session.

Residents can recycle variety of items in bin

Recycling is now as convenient as the bin by the maintenance building.

Residents can deposit all recyclable items in the bin without separating them first.

Here's what you can deposit:

- Paperboard such as empty cereal boxes
- Brown paper bags
- Phone books, catalogues and magazines

- Newspapers
- · Paper cardboard, dairy and juice containers
- Bulk mail.
- Glass bottles and jars Remove and discard lids.
- Aluminum cans
- Plastic bottles and containers #1 #7
 No plastic bags.
- Tin or steel cans
- Cardboard boxes
- Office and school paper

Here's what cannot be deposited in the recycling bin:

- No batteries
- No bubble wrap
- No chemicals
- No diapers
- No plastic foam containers, cups and packing peanuts
- No food-soiled paper or plastic containers
- No hardbound books
- No household hazardous waste
- No kitchen oils
- No paint
- No plastic bags
- No plastic utensils
- No tires
- No yard waste
