Here's what you can do to slow the spread of the virus

Wash your hands

- With warm water and soap for at least 20 seconds
- Often -- especially after touching doorknobs and other high-touch surfaces and after sneezing, blowing your nose or coughing
- Avoid touching your eyes, mouth and nose with unwashed hands.
- Use hand sanitizer with an alcohol content of at least 60 percent.

Avoid close contact

The virus is spread from person to person by close contact and through droplets from sneezes or coughs.

- Practice social distancing -- allow 6 feet between yourself and others.
- Avoid contact with people who are sick.

Clean and disinfect

- Surfaces that are frequently touched such as tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, key boards, toilets, faucets and sinks
- Clean dirty surfaces first with soap and water before disinfecting.

Cover coughs and sneezes

- With a tissue or the inside of your elbow
- Throw used tissues in the trash.
- Immediately wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- Use a hand sanitizer if soap and water are not readily available.

Vehicle Sanitation

Drivers are urged to clean and sanitize their vehicles by KidsAndCars.org, a national nonprofit dedicated to saving lives.

For those who must drive to work or run essential errands, please remember germs picked up in public places are deposited on car keys, door handles, the steering wheel and other vehicle surfaces.

Clean and sanitize car surfaces

- First with soapy water to remove grease and dirt
- Then with disinfectant
- After every trip

Top 12 frequently touched vehicle surfaces

- Car keys and fobs
- Exterior and interior door handles
- Steering wheel
- Power ignition button, window switches, radio GPS, other buttons and dials
- Gear shift
- Seat belts and buckles
- Car seats and booster seats
- Air vents
- Cup holders
- Grab handles
- Head rests
- Seat pockets
